Thank you for being with us this morning! Please be assured that our liturgical customs and hygiene practices are continually being adapted for pandemic considerations and to protect the health and safety of all. We hope that this will be a meaningful time of worship for you!

About the Service

Everything you need for the service can be found in this booklet and large print copies are also available. You may take this service bulletin home with you or discard it in the blue box as you exit. It will not be re-used.

Children & Families

The facilitator will seat you with all household members attending with you this morning. Please remain together throughout your time here and do not change or leave your seats once you have been seated. Should you require assistance at any time during the service, please let one of the greeters know and they will be happy to assist.

Washrooms

Our washrooms are available for urgent needs only and the washroom in Grannies Place has been designated for your use this morning. Should you need to use the washroom, we kindly ask that you wipe any touch surfaces with the available disinfectant wipes. The greeter or warden on duty will be available to assist you should you need to leave the service at any time.

Music

Music is an integral part of our service and we hope that it will deepen your worship experience this morning. At this time congregational singing is not permitted so please, just relax and enjoy. We ask that you remain in your seat at the conclusion of the service and follow the guidance of the sidesperson to exit the church.

Audio Loop

If you use a hearing aid with a "T" setting, you can take advantage of our audio loop in the main section (Nave) of the church.

"Collection"

We don't pass the collection plate at St. Christopher's. Instead, if you wish to make a financial contribution to support our ministries, there are donation boxes just inside the door into the worship space.

Communion

All are invited to share in the Holy Eucharist. Please remain seated until you are invited up the centre aisle by the greeter. Leave your mask on as you approach the priest, and follow the 6 ft. markings on the centre aisle as you wait. At this time we are offering communion in one kind, the bread, only. Please hold out your hands and the priest will drop the wafer into your hands (without touching you). Once you have received the wafer, please step to the communion station at the side. Once there, remove one side of your mask, place the wafer in your mouth, replace your mask, sanitize your hands, and return directly to your seat by the side aisle. If you are not comfortable receiving the bread, you can come forward to receive a blessing - just cross your arms over your chest; the priest will pray for God's blessing on you (without touching you). If you require gluten-free bread, please ask the priest.

General COVID-19 Protocols

Mask use is mandatory at all times in the building.

We encourage you to sanitize your hands frequently and there is sanitizer in many places throughout the church.

Please maintain physical distance of a minimum of 6' from those outside of your household group at all times. You will find markings on the floor to assist with this.

The Peace will be shared in place and using non-contact gestures.

Exiting the Building following the Service

Please remain in your seat and follow the guidance of the sidesperson to exit the church. Unfortunately, we are not able to offer coffee and fellowship as we usually would, and you will be asked to exit the building immediately after the service.

We gather for worship on the traditional territory of the Anishinaabeg, the Haudenosaunee, and the Métis peoples. This territory is included in the Dish with One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant. In a spirit of reconciliation we call to mind the 2015 Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada Report. The final report of the Commission includes 94 Calls to Action, the second of which calls upon the federal government, in collaboration with the provinces and territories, to prepare and publish annual reports on the number of Indigenous children (First Nations, Inuit, and Métis) who are in care, compared with non-Indigenous children. With respect, may we use our privilege to amplify the voices calling for this action to be implemented.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him, and asked him, 'Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: "You shall not murder; You shall not commit adultery; You shall not steal; You shall not bear false witness; You shall not defraud; Honour your father and mother." ' He said to him, 'Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.' Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, 'You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, 'How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!' And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, 'Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.' They were greatly astounded and said to one another, 'Then who can be saved?' Jesus looked at them and said, 'For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.'

Peter began to say to him, 'Look, we have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or fields, for my sake and for the sake of the good news, who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields, with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first.'
