Hurricane Melissa – Jamaica

Amazing Grace! St. Christopher's did it again!

Heartfelt thanks to everyone who rallied around so generously and contributed donated goods – food, clothing, bed linen and household items of various kinds – to help provide relief to people in Jamaica, many of whom lost everything in the recent hurricane. Hurricane Melissa, a Category 5 hurricane, hit Jamaica with winds of over 297 km. per hour and caused extensive damage across the island, leaving many people homeless.

Your enthusiastic response to last Sunday's appeal was simply incredible! We collected enough bags to fill a full-sized car and an SUV, twice over. (Yes, it took two trips to get the job done.) Donations were gratefully received by the Afro-Canadian Caribbean Association (ACCA) at their community centre on Barton Street in Hamilton. They are one of the centres designated by the Jamaican Consulate to receive donated goods to be transferred to Jamaica.

- 2 Go to stcb.ca and choose "Donate" (top right). Options there include:
 - a Regular offerings by pre-authorized payment from your bank account or by Visa.
 - b Special gifts, such as memorials or gifts to be directed to a particular ministry, by Visa or Mastercard. Be sure to specify where your gift should be credited.
- 3 E-transfer from your bank account to this email address: acctg@stcb.ca
- 4 Phone the church - we can receive your credit card information over the phone and process the transaction.
